

# Redfield Foundation Report 2023-2024

### **Background Information**

The Career Quest program is an educational program designed to connect students in Northern Nevada with career opportunities in science, technology, engineering, arts, and mathematics (STEAM). This program has continued to expand since its inception in 2015, and the growth of this program is due to the continuous support of Envirolution's community partners. In the 2023-2024 school year, the Redfield Foundation contributed to supporting 8 Career Quest events for four different schools that are supported by the Redfield Community Outreach Program (RCOP).

With the funding and support from the Redfield Foundation, Envirolution was able to take students to the Tesla Gigafactory and Truckee Meadows Water Authority. At the Tesla Gigafactory, students are given an exclusive tour of the manufacturing processes, students listen to a presentation on career opportunities at Tesla, students participate in an activity in which they construct a simple version of a Tesla motor, and students eat in the Tesla cafeteria. At Truckee Meadows Water Authority, students are bussed to the Verdi Hydroelectric plant to learn about renewable energy and eat lunch, then students are bussed to the Chalk Bluff water treatment facility where they are given a tour of the water treatment process and then watch demonstrations of the water treatment process. Envirolution was planned to take Mamie Toweles to Click Bond, an aviation adhesive manufacturing company, however, this trip was canceled by the teacher due to poor behavior.

# The Impact of Redfield's Support





Figure 1 shows interest in science, technology, engineering, art, and math before and after attending Career Quest

With the support of Redfield, Envirolution was able to carry out 7 out of the 8 events scheduled. The last event was canceled due to student behavior. The 7 events brought 175 students from Hidden Valley Elementary, Mamie Towles Elementary School, Cold Springs Middle School, Dilworth Middle School. Attending Career Quest events helps students gain interest in fields pertaining to the industry that the students visited. According to the pre-survey and post-survey data, Career Quest events helped increase the students' interest in engineering, technology, and mathematics. Data from the events is displayed in Figures 1-4.

#### **Future Improvements**



The following areas are the focus points for improvements to Career Quest events for the 2024-2025 school year. - 1. Improve each Career Quest presentation to add information about tuition assistance programs and how to stay connected with the business after each Career Quest
- 2. Improve the pre-survey and post-survey to enhance the data captured by focusing on measuring: student knowledge of what the industry partner does, student knowledge on career paths, and other metrics unique to each industry partner
- 3. Restructuring recruitment strategies to ensure that Title 1 schools and students of underrepresented populations are more represented in the Career Quest program
